1. Jonathan Fullwood - Convicted of Felony at Epiphany Sessions 1787 - Ordered to be Imprisoned 2 years and to pay a Fine of £10.
2. Anne Price - Convicted of Felony at Summer Assizes 1787 - Ordered to be Transported beyond the Seas for 7 years.
3. Ann Stockwell at Harvey } Convicted of Felony at Lent Assizes 1788 -
4. Ann Davis } Ordered to be severally Transported beyond the
5. Elizabeth Stringer } Seas for 7 years.
6. Mark Ferrell - Convicted at Easter Sessions 1788 of buying Spanish ends of yarn &c. - Ordered to be Imprisoned 2 years.
7. William Bateman } Condemned at Summer Assizes 1788 and afterwards -
8. Anselm Parsons } Reprieved &
9. Robert Dence - Convicted at the same Assizes of wilful Perjury - Ordered to be Transported beyond the Seas for 7 years.
10. Peter Payne - Convicted at the same Assizes of stealing Copper - Ordered to be Transported beyond the Seas for 7 years.
11. John Teague . . . } Convicted at the same Assizes of stealing Bed Cloathes
12. William & Nishman } Ordered to be Transported beyond the Seas for 7 years.
13. Jonathan Griffiths - Convicted at the same Assizes of stealing Goods - Ordered to be Transported beyond the Seas for 7 years.
14. Ann Risby - Convicted at Michaelmas Sessions 1788 of assaulting one Heester Drew - Ordered to be Imprisoned 6 Months and then Discharged &
15. John Morgan - Brought in February 12th 1788 Committed by S. Hayward Esquire for one year unless he shall in the mean time pay a forfeiture of £30, being convicted of stealing a Deer in his Majesty's Forest of Deane. -
16. Rebecca Bunting - Brought in July 28th Com^d. by D. Willoy Gent &

Coroner charged with the wilful Murder of a Male
Bastard Child.

17. George Sansum - Brought in September 11th 1788 Committed by Peter
Hawker Clerk charged on Suspicion of breaking open (in the
night time) and entering the Store or Drying-house
belonging to Mess^{rs} Eyecott, Stanton and Lewis Clothiers
and stealing therein about 50 lb of White Spanish Wool
18. Thomas Tuckwell - Brought in September 15th Comm^d by A. Soffe Esquire
Charged on Oath and his own Confession of being concerned in
stealing at a Mill belonging to one George Bramble a Quantity
of Meal, the property of the said George Bramble
19. William Coleman - Ordered into Custody at Summer Assizes 1788 to take
his Trial at the next Assizes for wilful and corrupt Perjury.
20. Robert Williams - Brought in October 18th Comm^d by A. Soffe Esq^r
charged on Oath and his own Confession of stealing from a
Mill belonging to George Bramble, his Master, a Quantity
of Meal the property of the said George Bramble.
21. James Nicholls - Brought in October 18th Comm^d by J. Sheppard Esquire
charged by the Oath of one Sarah Hazell with assaulting
her and committing a Rape on her Body.
22. John Glover - Brought in October 23rd Comm^d by D. Willey Gent: Coroner
charged with the wilful Murder of one William Bayloy.
23. Joseph Grecian - Brought in November 10th Comm^d by W. Buckle
Esquire for 3 Calendar Months unless he shall sooner pay
a Fine of £10, being Convicted of using Greyhounds &c
for the Destruction of the Game &c?

24. Thomas Jefferis - Brought in January 6th 1789 Committed by H. Crosswicke Esquire charged with being concerned with other Persons in stealing from a Colmine Quantities of Coal value 5^s and upwards the Property of Mess^{rs} Patton and James Gentlemen - Out upon Bail

25. Robert Carvey - Brought in January 7th Comm. by J. Sheppard Esquire charged with stealing in the Dwelling-house of William Milton a Silver Watch and Wearing apparel - And also with stealing in the Dwelling-house of one Benjamin Butler 30 Guineas in Gold Linn.
