In the Supreme Court of Van Diemen's Land (now called Tasmania)

our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty three the last Will and Testament of George Plummer late of the West Tamar in Tasmania Gentleman deceased a true Copy whereof is hereto annexed was exhibited and proved before this Honorable Court and that Administration of all and singular the goods Chattels rights Credits and effects of the said deceased within the Limits of Tasmania and the Dependancies thereof was and is hereby committed to Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer both of the West Tamar in Tasmania Farmers the Executors named in the said Will they the said Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer having law first duly sworn well and truly to perform the said Will by paying first the debts of the said deceased and then the legacies therein bequeathed so far as the estate shall thereto extend and the Law bind them and to make and exhibit unto this Honorable Court a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods Chattels rights Credits and effects of the said deceased on or before the Twelfth first day of October now next ensuing And to render a just and true account of their executorship when they shall be lawfully thereto called and that they believe the goods Chattels rights Credits and effects of the said deceased at the time of his death did not exceed in value the sum of Sixty pounds in Tasmania and the Dependancies hereof

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Supreme Court of Van Diemen's Land (now called Tasmania) this Seventy third day of April in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty three.

This is the last Will and Testament of me George Plummer of the West Tamar in Tasmania Gentleman I give and bequeath all my furniture household goods and effects consumable stores and all other my personal Estate to my dear Wife Sarah absolutely I give and devise the Messuage or Dwellinghouse at present occupied by me on the West Tamar To the use of my dear Wife Sarah for and during her life and from and immediately after her decease I give and devise the said Messuage or Dwellinghouse unto and to the use of my sons Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer their heirs and assigns for ever as Tenants in common I give to my dear Wife the yearly rent charge of One hundred and fifty pounds clear of all deductions out of my lands and hereditaments hereafter devised to my said sons Jonathan and George to commence from my decease and be paid quarterly and a proportionate part for the time between the last quarter day and the day of her death to be paid immediately after her decease I authorize my Wife her Executors Administrators or assigns whenever such rent charge shall be in arrear for fourteen days to receive the same and all costs by distress upon the said lands and hereditaments and whenever such rent charge shall be in arrear for twenty eight days to recover the same and all immediately accrued arrears and all costs by entry upon and perception of the Rents and profits of all or any of the said lands and hereditaments without being impeachable of waste I give and devise all those One hundred acres of land purchased by me from the Crown situate at the back of my Tamar on the West Tamar between lands purchased by my sons Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer unto and to the use of my son Henry Plummer his heirs and assigns for ever he or they paying and discharging any sum of money that may be owing upon the same at the time of my death I give and devise all the rest residue and remainder of my Real Estate (except such lands as are vested in me as trustee or mortgagee) unto and to the use of my sons Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer their heirs and assigns for ever as tenants in common they paying and discharging any sum of money that may be owing upon the same at the time of my decease I give and devise unto the said Jonathan Plummer and George Plummer their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns all such real estates as are vested in me as trustee or mortgagee upon the trusts and for the purposes for which the same are respectively held by me but so nevertheless that my beneficial interest as Mortgage therein shall go and be considered as part of my personal Estate And I constitute and appoint my said sons Jonathan Plummer <sup>and George Plummer</sup> Executors of this my Will And hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made I declare this only to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I the said George Plummer the Testator have to this my last Will and Testament contained in two sheets of Pink Paper set my hand this Twenty fifth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty one, George Plummer
