Mr. S. Potts

THE Mudgee district lost a very old and well known resident when Mr Sloper Potts passed away on Tuesday night at the age of 73.

The late Mr Potts died at the residence of one of his sons in Inglis street, following an attack of influenza. He had lived in this district practically all his life, and for a long time at Avisford, where his death has been the cause of very deep regret. Mr Potts had been for many years a capable and trusted employee of the Cudgegong Shire Council, and was maintenance man before the inauguration of the shire council system. In this capacity he was held in respect and

was held in very great esteem by the councillors, the public and his fellow employees, and his work at all times gave every satisfaction to all concerned. Thorough, conscientious and painstaking, he was a worker of the finest type, and the council was sorry to lose his services when he retired about two years ago. On that occasion he was entertained at a presentation social by the councillors, and was highly praised by numerous speakers. At the council's meeting yesterday deep regret was expressed at his death, and tributes were paid to his ability and character. Mr Potts is survived by a wife and family.

The funeral took place this afternoon after a service in the Church of England, interment being made in the Church of England portion of the Mudjee Cemetery. Arrange-
